About the Book
The Golden Goblet, written in 1961, follows the life of a 12-year-old Egyptian boy named Randa, who lives in Egypt around 1400 BC. Randa's mother and father die, leaving him an orphan in the care of his uncaring half-brother Gaba. Randa's father was an accomplished goldsmith and raised him so that he could become an apprentice to further learn the craft. However, Gaba has other plans. Gaba only gives Randa permission to work as a painter, or helper, in his local goldsmith.

Randa makes two marvelous friends, Raget and the Anank. With their help, he uncovers and solves a mystery involving tomb-robbing, one of the most serious offenses in ancient Egypt. In attempting to bring the perpetrators to justice, Randa is dismissed from the goldsmith shop by a government. He perseveres through his many hardships, learning who to trust and choosing who to trust and remaining true while working to do what is right.

The religious practices of the ancient Egyptians are brought to light throughout The Golden Goblet, which served as a means of support for the dead in the afterlife, an elaborate funeral necessary were buried with the dead. Without these objects, old Egyptians believed that the afterlife would be difficult. All aspects of the religion of ancient Egypt shaped daily life, but concepts like the Golden Goblet and other items of significant importance, and provide some insights into the culture's morality.

The Golden Goblet won a Newbery Honor award for the year 1962.
